CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION

Overview

The 2012 State of the Science (SOS) Congress on Nursing Research **Discovery through Innovation** will examine current trends in harnessing the best interdisciplinary research teams, most able to use the power of data and technology, to develop the most relevant science to improve the health of the nation. The Conference will focus on the ways nurse scientists are applying innovative approaches to complex health problems and health care issues to advance the science.

This biennial research dissemination conference allows nurse researchers from around the world to join with recognized scientific experts, funding agencies, and policy makers, to explore emerging scientific discoveries related to nursing and health care practice. In addition to individual podium, symposia and poster sessions, this year's Congress offers plenary and panel sessions. Special sessions include roundtable breakfasts with editors of major nursing research journals and opportunities to meet with funding agency consultants during the NINR 'One-on-One' sessions.

Overall Objectives

- Predict how interdisciplinary teams can lead to greater improvements in health
- Debate the effectiveness of different approaches to discovery
- Apply discoveries to a variety of health problems

Target Audience

The Council has planned the Congress to target the needs of nurse scientists; faculty members, pre- and post-doctoral fellows, and undergraduate and graduate students in nursing and the health sciences; vendors; and supporters of nursing science.

Parking

For hotel overnight guests, the rate to valet is \$39/night, with in/out privileges. To self park, it is \$34/night, with in/out privileges. To get to the parking garage, from Connecticut Avenue, take a right on T Street and drive alongside the perimeter of the hotel. Drive past the T Street Ballroom entrance, and at the first intersection, take a hard left onto Florida Avenue, and then another left onto 19th Street. History

Built in 1965 and a top-to-bottom makeover in 2010, the Washington Hilton hotel is a contemporary urban retreat situated on several acres near DuPont Circle in the heart of the nation's capital. Conference attendees will enjoy being in the center of the District's most sought after neighborhoods including Adams Morgan, Woodley Park, and the U Street Corridor. The hotel is a mile from the Smithsonian National Zoo and just 4 blocks from the DuPont Circle Metro Station on the Red Line.

TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

Travel by Metro (Public Commuter Rail)

The **Dupont Circle Metro Station** on the **Red Line** is closest Metro Station to the hotel. Exit at the north end of the Station to Q Street and walk four blocks north on Connecticut Avenue to Hilton Washington.

Travel by Air

Ronald Reagan National Airport (DCA) is approximately 6 miles away and 20 minutes travel time by car (without traffic). Approximate one-way charge to Washington Hilton hotel: \$4/metro, \$19/cab.

Dulles International Airport (IAD) is located in Northern Virginia and is approximately 30 miles away and 45 minutes travel time by car (without traffic). Approximate one-way charge to Washington Hilton hotel: \$55/cab.

Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport (BWI) is located just south of Baltimore, Maryland and is approximately 35 miles and 60 minutes travel time by car (without traffic). Approximate one-way charge to Washington Hilton hotel: \$6.50/metro, \$65/cab.
